Background on Planning Area:

The California Statewide Interoperability Executive Committee (CALSIIEC) was established in 2003, by the Director of the Governor's Office of Emergency Services (OES), to consolidate California's administration of state and nationally designated Mutual Aid (interoperability) channels, and to fulfill California's responsibilities outlined by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) in 47 C.F.R. §90.525.

To address the requirements of regional communications interoperability, while maintaining a statewide framework, CALSIIEC established four (4) Planning Area subcommittees in 2004. The Planning Areas are designed to work in collaboration with the statewide CALSIIEC (<http://www.calsiee.org/>) and the Public Safety Radio Strategic Planning Committee (PSRSPC)(<http://psrspc.ca.gov/>).
