Meeting Purpose: This meeting will focus on channel issues and frequency lists and further development of the group's charter. The meeting agenda will be posted on the CALSIEC website <http://www.calsiec.org> in addition to this announcement and minutes from the first meeting on October 27.

The California Statewide Interoperability Executive Committee (CALSIEC) was established in 2003, by the Director of the Governor's Office of Emergency Services (OES), to consolidate California's administration of state and nationally designated Mutual Aid (interoperability) channels, and to fulfill California's responsibilities outlined by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) in 47 C.F.R. §90.525. To address the requirements of regional communications interoperability, while maintaining a statewide framework, CALSIEC established four (4) Planning Area subcommittees in 2004. The Capitol-Bay Area Planning Area is composed of OES Mutual Aid Regions II and IV. The counties of Del Norte and Humboldt will decide whether to link with the CALSIEC Capitol-Bay or the Northern Planning Area.

This meeting is open to the public. Representatives of Federal, State, Local Government, and Tribal Public Safety agencies, and non-governmental organizations (eligible to hold FCC Public Safety Radio Services authorizations) are encouraged to participate. OES welcomes RSVPs from attendees for planning purposes. OES MAR II include counties of: Alameda, Contra Costa, Del Norte (may chose to link instead to CALSIEC Northern Planning Area), Humboldt (may chose to link instead to CALSIEC Northern Planning Area), Lake, Marin, Mendocino, Monterey, Napa, San Benito, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Solano, Sonoma. OES MAR IV includes counties of: Alpine, Amador, Calaveras, El Dorado, Nevada, Placer, Sacramento, San Joaquin, Stanislaus, Tuolumne, Yolo.
