

CaISCIIP Vision

Definition of a Vision:

Describes the core values and purpose that guide the organization toward which change is directed

Criteria of a Successful Vision:

- Incorporates peoples ideals, fantasies, or dreams of what they would like the organization's outcomes to look like or be
- Energizes commitment for change within the relevant field of work, but is not seen as impossible
 - Ex: President Kennedy's vision of "Putting a man on the moon and returning him safely to earth"
- Represent's the organizations core purpose by providing idealistic motivation for working towards bold and valued outcomes demonstrated in the desired future state



CalSCIP Vision

By 2017, ensure all local, regional, tribal, state and federal public safety first-responders and designated public service organizations operating within California will be able to communicate using compatible systems, in real time, across disciplines and jurisdictions, to respond more effectively during day-to-day operations and major incidents.

CalSCIP Goals

- **Goal 1: Governance** – Maintain coordinated governance for integrated regional and statewide public safety voice and data interoperable communications systems planning
- **Goal 2: Standard Operating Procedures** – Maintain NIMS/SEMS compliant Standard Operating Procedures for statewide interoperable communications
- **Goal 3: Technology** – Develop a statewide standards based *System of Systems* communications network for California's public safety and designated public service practitioners
- **Goal 4: Training & Exercise** – Ensure regular local, regional and statewide interoperable communications training and exercise opportunities for California's public safety and designated public service practitioners
- **Goal 5: Usage** – Encourage daily usage statewide of interoperable communications equipment and standard operating procedures



CaISCIIP Objectives

- **Objective 1:** Provide interoperability governance and outreach statewide
- **Objective 2:** Achieve communications operability for state agencies and localities as necessary to support interoperability
- **Objective 3:** Achieve voice and data interoperable communications within each locality to enhance multi-discipline response capabilities for local response
- **Objective 4:** Achieve multi-discipline and multi-jurisdiction voice and data interoperable communications to enhance regional response capabilities
- **Objective 5:** Enhance state agencies' voice and data interoperable communications across California to provide comprehensive support during emergencies




CaISCIIP Objectives

- ***Objective 6:*** Provide tools necessary for region to region and state to region voice and data interoperable communications to enhance mutual aid response capabilities
- ***Objective 7:*** Enhance communications back-up and redundancy for interoperability systems to ensure communications are maintained following catastrophic events
- ***Objective 8:*** Support interoperable communications with federal entities, other states and countries to respond to national, multi-state and international emergencies
- ***Objective 9:*** Achieve the integration of private entities identified as part of critical infrastructure/key resources and the participants in the state emergency operation plan (EOP) into interoperability efforts to ensure communications are maintained during emergencies and recovery efforts





Administrative Regions with Mutual Aid Regions




Coastal Region Mutual Aid Region II





	CA Mutual Aid Region I, VI & V = Southern Planning Areas	



Governance Initiatives

- **Proposed Initiative 3:** Define and strengthen the integration between the Mutual Aid Regions and the CALSIEC Planning Areas for coordinated development and implementation
 - SAFECOM Criteria 4.2
- **Proposed Initiative 4:** Identify and support a dedicated California Interoperability Coordinator responsible for the implementation of the CalSCIP and coordination of statewide communications interoperability planning.
 - SAFECOM Criteria 10.6
 - Tasks include:
 - Developing an outreach plan educating policy makers and practitioners



Technology Initiatives

- **Proposed Initiative 5:** Provide a dedicated resource and/or initiative action team to develop and implement the System of Systems Preliminary Draft Project Plan (see System of Systems Preliminary Draft Project Plan Appendix X).
 - SAFECOM Criteria 5.2
 - Tasks include:
 - Coordinate with the regions and localities to ensure necessary operability of the existing systems is addressed
 - Develop an RFI for obtaining industry expertise on the interconnections in the Systems of System concept
 - Further refine the System of Systems Statement of Requirements (SoR) refer to Appendix x)).
 - Consider the Functional and Operational Considerations Checklist that will be employed to verify all stakeholder requirements are accommodated by the developing System of Systems solution (see Appendix x).



Technology Initiatives

- **Proposed Initiative 6:** Identify a process for completion of the statewide capabilities assessment by leveraging TICPs and CASM if appropriate.
 - SAFECOM Criteria 5.1
 - Tasks include:
 - Evaluate CASM in detail, to identify and address any CASM deficiencies or variances relative to the state's requirements
 - Encourage all localities to insert technical and geographical data into CASM
 - Encourage all localities to allow for statewide sharing of CASM data
 - (Note: this will be enhanced once OHS provides us with their CASM methodology and objectives)



Training & Exercise Initiatives

- **Proposed Initiative 7:** Develop a training strategy and implement a long-term, continuous training program for communications interoperability.
 - SAFECOM Criteria 7.1
 - Tasks Include:
 - Continue to enhance and augment an interoperable communications training program that is SEMS/NIMS compliant.
 - Coordinate with the CSTI and the six Mutual Aid Regions to identify, develop, coordinate and promote statewide multi-discipline communications interoperability training efforts.
 - Develop statewide COML training curriculum and class offerings
 - Design an equipment training program for the various cache resources and telecommunications equipment available via mission tasking requests.
 - Collaborate with CALSIEC on the development of a multi-discipline communications training program.



SOP Initiatives

- **Proposed Initiative 8:** Provide a dedicated resource and/or initiative action team to develop a communications Field Operations Guide as an effort to compile the statewide SOPs (add tasks).
 - SAFECOM Criteria 6.0
- **Proposed initiative 9:** Develop a Mutual Aid Gateway SOPs (add tasks)
 - SAFECOM Criteria 6.0
- **Proposed Initiative 10:** Create a Common Language Protocol across California (add tasks)
 - SAFECOM Criteria 6.0



SOP Initiatives

- **Proposed Initiative 11:** Define a statewide process for the approval and use of shared interoperability channels (add tasks)
 - SAFECOM Criteria 6.2
- **Proposed Initiative 12:** Build upon and enhance on existing regional level efforts for coordination with neighboring states and Mexico at the OES and CALSIEC levels
 - SAFECOM Criteria 2.2
- **Proposed Initiative 13:** Develop any needed statewide planning for communications interoperability with safety and security elements of the major transit systems, ports, and rail operations
 - SAFECOM Criteria 2.6


